The black mamba has quite a reputation. It is one of the world's deadliest snakes. It is the fastest land snake in the world, and the longest species of venomous snake in Africa and the second longest in the world. This snake's potential danger has been the subject of many African myths and it has been blamed for thousands of human deaths.

Contrary to what its name would suggest, black mambas are actually brownish in colour, ranging from olive to greyish tones, with paler bellies. They are named for the coloration of the inside of their mouths, which is a deep, inky black. Similar to cottonmouths, when threatened a mamba will open its mouth to show the black lining as a

warning signal. Black mambas have coffin-shaped heads and are lithe, athletic snakes. They can grow to be 14 feet long (4.25 metres), though their average length is around 8 feet (2.4 m). These giants can live up to 11 years in the wild.
