- Introduction of the Balance Curriculum and Assessment tool

One to one and small group tuition

• 1:1 tuition provided by a qualified teacher, three afternoons per week.

Extended School Time

• Extended school day for pupils in Year 6 to provide 'Secondary ready' support in terms of academic success and confidence/resilience.

Supporting parents and carers

- Additional hours for the newly appointed Attendance Lead
- Additional training for Attendance Lead from Compass Buzz, the Early Help Service and Child Protection pathways
- Purchase of a premium subscription to Doodle Maths, English, Spelling and Tables for all children form Reception Class to Year 6.

Access to Technology

• Purchase of 45 new chromebooks enabling all children in KS2 to have their personal chromebook. Acquisition of a small number of second hand chromebooks to lend out to families in KS1 who would benefit from additional technology to support learning at home.
