Did you know that animals have been adapting for years? We started off as an ape. Some animals that have adapted you may not know. Alaskan wood frogs' bodies freeze up in the winter to survive -80 degrees! Then when it is warm again, they come back to life. Cuttlefish can change their colour and texture in order to blend into their surroundings. They can detect how much light is being absorbed into the environment. They have 3 skin layers (yellow, red, and brown), these can be stretched in different ways to make unique colours and patterns. Their skin also has papillae, which let cuttlefish appear rigid, like coral. Together, these features allow cuttlefish to escape predators, as well as sneak up on unsuspecting prey.
